#### KEYNOTE SPEAKER: Dr Mark Lowenthal



Dr Lowenthal is President of the Intelligence & Security Academy. He also has served as Assistant Director of Central Intelligence (ADCI) for Analysis & Production; Vice Chairman for Evaluation, National Intelligence Council; Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Intelligence; and Staff Director, House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI).

#### SESSION: Intelligence in a Changing World

This keynote address seeks to offer a geopolitical framework for discussing some of the parameters of a rapidly changing international environment: what has changed; why have the changes occurred; what this means for intelligence analysts; and which factors or trends may be more or less meaningful in the near term.

#### SEMINAR CONTENT

These seminars will seek to examine the effects created by a proliferation of actors, combined with growing interconnectedness through ubiquitous technology, all factors which compress the time available for intelligence analysis. This creates complexity and uncertainty for decision makers looking for immediate solutions to issues confronting them in an environment of 'now'.
